To require the Secretary of Agriculture to grant an easement to Chugach Alaska Corporation.

Mr. Young of Alaska introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

# A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to grant an easement to Chugach Alaska Corporation.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. CHUGACH ALASKA CORPORATION SETTLE-
4	MENT IMPLEMENTATION.
5	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—
6	(1) pursuant to section 1430 of the Alaska Na-
7	tional Interest Lands Conservation Act, the Sec-
8	retary of the Interior, the Secretary of Agriculture,
9	the State of Alaska, and Chugach Alaska Corpora-

tion (the Native Regional Corporation organized

1	under the authority of the Alaska Native Claims
2	Settlement Act for the Chugach people of the Chu-
3	gach Region and formerly known as Chugach Na-
4	tives, Inc.) were directed to study land ownership in
5	and around the Chugach Region for the purposes
6	of—
7	(A) providing a fair and just land settle-
8	ment for the Chugach people and realizing the
9	intent, purpose, and promise of the Alaska Na-
10	tive Claims Settlement Act by the Chugach
11	Alaska Corporation; and
12	(B) identifying lands that, to the maximum
13	extent possible, are of the like, kind, and char-
14	acter of those traditionally used and occupied
15	by the Chugach people, and, to the maximum
16	extent possible, are coastal accessible and eco-
17	nomically viable;
18	(2) on September 17, 1982, the aforementioned
19	parties entered into the 1982 Chugach Natives, Inc.
20	Settlement Agreement in order to set forth agree-
21	ment a fair and just land settlement for the Chu-
22	gach people pursuant to the study directed by Con-
23	gress, which among its many provisions—
24	(A) required the United States to convey

to Chugach Alaska Corporation not more than

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- 73,308 acres of land in the vicinity of Carbon Mountain, which tract of land contains significant natural resources, but is inaccessible by road; and
  - (B) granted Chugach Alaska Corporation rights-of-way across Chugach National Forest to such tract of land and required the United States to grant to Chugach Alaska Corporation an easement for the purpose of constructing and using roads and other facilities necessary for development of that tract of land on terms and conditions to be determined by the Settlement Agreement;
  - (3) without the such easements, the lands conveyed to Chugach Alaska Corporation in the vicinity of Carbon Mountain cannot be utilized or developed in a manner consistent with the intent of Congress as expressed in the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act and the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act;
  - (4) Chugach Alaska Corporation and the United States Forest Service have been unable to reach agreement on the procedures to be used for granting the easement to Chugach Alaska Corporation or on

- the terms and conditions related to such easement;
  and
- (5) the easement required under the 1982 Chu gach Natives, Inc. Settlement Agreement should be
   granted without further delay.

### (b) Easement Conveyance Implementation.—

- (1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Agriculture shall, in accordance with the appropriate environmental studies, grant Chugach Alaska Corporation an irrevocable and perpetual 500-foot-wide easement for the construction, use, and maintenance of roads and related facilities necessary for access to and economic development of the land interests in the Carbon Mountain and Katalla vicinity that were conveyed to Chugach Alaska Corporation pursuant to the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act. The centerline of the easement is depicted on the map entitled "Carbon Mountain Access Easement" and dated November 4, 1997.
- (2) Submission of survey; relinquishment of unneeded portion of easement.—Not later than 90 days after completion of construction of roads and related facilities on the easement granted

pursuant to paragraph (1), Chugach Alaska Corporation shall submit to the Secretary of Agriculture
an as-built survey of such roads and related facilities
and relinquish to the United States those portions of
the easement Chugach Alaska Corporation deems
not necessary for future use.

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
